British Fencing Membership/Insurance

Affiliation with the British Fencing requires all club members to have a membership with them. For this reason, British Fencing membership is a **mandatory** requirement to fence at Watford Fencing Club.

British Fencing membership provides you with personal accident and civil liability insurance, which protects you and other members in case of any accidents.

The British Fencing offers two types of membership, full and social, and these are described below.

Members who join via one of our beginners' courses get their Starter membership for **FREE**, Watford Fencing Club arranges this for you. After the first year, you need to take out either British Fencing Recreational or Compete membership to continue fencing at the club. If you would like to upgrade to British Fencing Compete membership please speak with a member of the committee who will let you know how you can upgrade.

Recreational British Fencing Membership

Compete British Fencing Membership

- Basic Recreational for Fencers in Clubs
 NOT for members who wish to enter competitions
- Cost for full (aged over 18) £24 per annum
- Cost for full (aged over 16 but under 18) £15
- Personal accident (cover ceases at 75 and is limited for U16) & civil liability insurance cover
- Covers you for any UK club session and in recreational (non-competitive) events.
- Members Over 18: Notices of general meetings; right to vote at general meetings and right to vote in ballots for election of directors

- For fencers who wish to compete
- Cost for full (aged over 18) £48 per annum
- Cost for full (aged over 16 but under 18) £36
- Personal accident (cover ceases at 75 and is limited for U16) & civil liability insurance cover
- Cover as for Recreational plus Regional/County/National training and competitive events in UK and abroad.
- Members Over 18: Notices of general meetings; right to vote at general meetings and right to vote in ballots for election of directors

All our coaches are registered coaches with our national governing body, British Fencing, and hold recognised coaching qualifications.

Professional Coaches

Head Coach - Lajos Fazekas



Lajos has over 47 years of fencing experience and has been coaching the sport for over 28 years. He was the leader of the Hungarian Modern Pentathlon Talent Programme between 1980 – 1990.

He was also the Head Coach of the Junior Hungarian Modern Pentathlon team at the World Championship in 1990.

Lajos holds a British Fencing Level 4 Epee and Level 1 Sabre qualification, however coaches all three weapons within the club.

He coaches at the club every week of the month and offers individual lessons. He also runs various group sessions throughout the year.

Sabre Coach - Daren Tee

Daren has fenced both nationally and internationally for over 20 years and has won Gold medals at the British Polytechnics Championships, National Sabre Team Championship and Venlo International Tournaments (The Netherlands).

He also coaches at North London Sabre Club, which is one of the leading Sabre clubs in the United Kingdom and is also a long term member and coach of Bedford Fencing Club.

Daren holds a Level 4 Sabre and Level 3 Foil coaching qualification from British Fencing.

He coaches at Watford Fencing Club as a semi-regular coach and attends 17 sessions throughout the year.

Chris has over 35 years fencing experience, winning a number of medals at county level. Chris holds a Level 3 Foil, Level 2 Sabre and a Level 1 Epee coaching qualification from the British Academy of Fencing.


As well as coaching with us, Chris also coaches at our sister club Three Rivers Young Blades (TRYB).

Chris helps coach the beginners' as well as the intermediate Silver Foil and Bronze Sabre courses following the completion of the beginners' course.

Armoury

Watford Fencing Club employs the services of a professional armourer to maintenance the clubs stock of weapons and scoring equipment. In addition to this he attends the club at least once a quarter to offer his services to members.

Equipment Requirements/Recommendations

Mask Minimum 350 Newton Bib. For Foil competitions, a lame' bib is now

compulsory.

Under Plastron Minimum 800 Newton for electric fencing.

Breeches This is mandatory for fencing electric, minimum 350 Newton.

Socks Socks which fully cover the legs up to the breeches are a

mandatory requirement in conjunction with breeches.

Jacket Minimum 350 Newton.

Chest Protector This is mandatory for female fencers.

Lamé This is required for Electric Foil and Sabre; there are two types depending on

the weapon.

Glove 350 Newton for Foil and Epee. An 800N glove with a lame cuff/overlay is

mandatory for Sabre.

Shoes Trainers are fine although you can buy specialized fencing shoes which

provide special padding and are great for lunging.

Bodywire Either Bayonet or Two Pin connector for Foil or Sabre, or three pin for Epée.

Weapon This really comes down to personal taste and style, probably one of the

most personal choices you can make when it comes to fencing equipment. We recommend that you speak to the club coaches and other members about their weapons, and don't be afraid to ask them for a go with their's. Most

members will be more than happy to let you have a try.

Bag You will need something to carry this all in; there are loads of choices from

different suppliers. Again ask to see what other members have.

NOTE: Newton is the means that the clothing has been tested to withstand at least a set amount of newtons of force. This comes in two types 350 newtons (350N) and 800 newtons (800N). All protective equipment must be a minimum 350N with the exception of the under plastron which must be a minimum 800N for electric fencing. This is governed by the World Governing Body of Fencing Fédération Internationale d'Escrime (FIE).
